Federal monies specified in the appropriations bill cannot be regarded as immediately available for expenditure. Pursuant to NJSA 52:27B-26, I direct that expenditures be permitted under these appropriations only upon determination by the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting that federal funds to support any expenditure are receivable or have been received by the State.

Fiscal year 1998 revenues have been revised downward by \$8.3 million due to lower collections in Lottery (\$6.0 million) and Casino Revenue (\$2.3 million).

Fiscal year 1999 revenues have been revised downward by \$15.0 million (Federal Indirect Cost Recoveries-\$7.0 million, Lottery-\$4.5 million and Motor Fuels-\$3.5 million).
